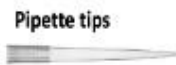


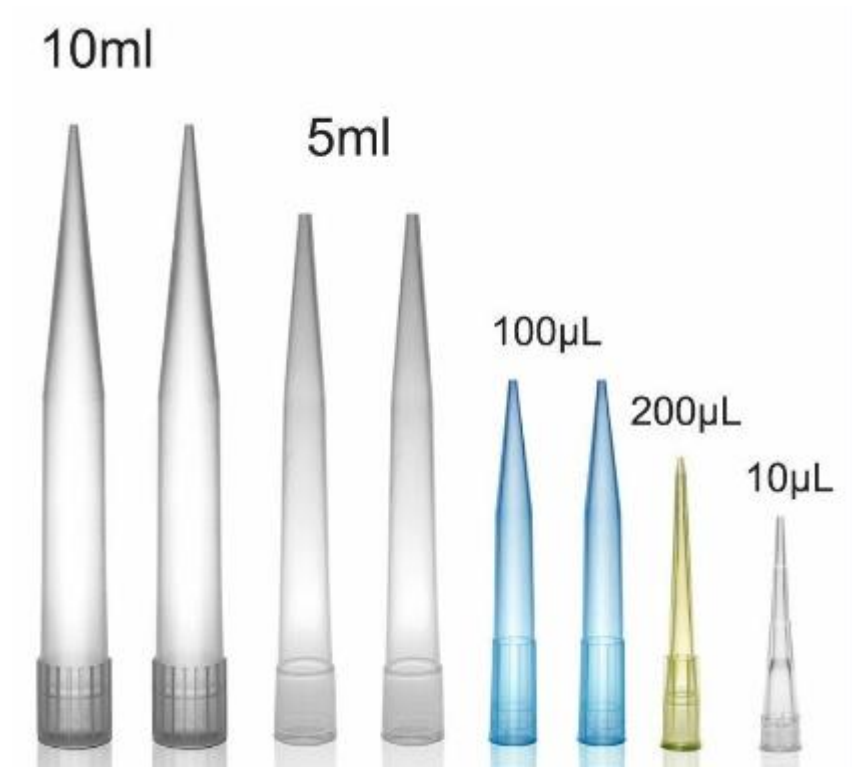
Plastic recycling Notes

 PS Polystyrene	Examples: Plastic test tubes 
 O Other	Examples: Electronics

Lab Hard Plastics Recycling Options

Accepted Materials:



High Density Polyethylene



Polypropylene

Lids

Accepted Materials:

All hard-plastic containers that:

- Previously contained non-hazardous materials.
- Are empty, rinsed clean, and dry.
- Are stamped with one of the following resin identification codes: #2 (HDPE) and #5 (PP),
- #2 (HDPE) and #5 (PP) must be placed into separate containers/IBCs

Note: All Chemical labels should be removed or defaced.

Not Accepted:

- Materials previously containing or contaminated with any hazardous materials (i.e. toxic, biohazardous, radioactive).
- Containers that are stamped with the following resin identification codes: #1 (PET), #3 (PVC), #4 (LDPE), #6 (PS – rigid polystyrene only) or #7 (O – other materials including biodegradable and compostable plastics).
- Containers that are not stamped with a resin identification code.
